Clinician Fitting Guide VENUM Universal TLSO PPX




Step 1

Measure circumference of the patient's waist at the smallest point and use sizing chart to determine patient size



Step 4

Remove waist pads



Step 7

On the left side repeat the process but increase the size to the next size up to compensate for the thoracic section. (E.g. a patient that is sized at medium would show medium on the right hand side and medium/large on the left side)



Step 10

Place lateral side panels in position to sit central on the waist pad



Step 2

Remove sternal cover to anterior upright remove anterior thoracic section from lumbar belt by loosening the three straps



Step 5

Adjust belt on non-thoracic section side to required size by removing the right hand side and adjusting to the size from the sizing chart



Step 8

Reattach left hand panel by placing against back section



Step 11

Remove anterior plastic section from abdominal section



Step 3

To size brace, lay brace open out on bed and remove the side panels from both sides



Place hole over required size and reattach right hand panel by placing





Step 12

To size anterior section lay patient supine on bed and place on patient with the distal trim at area of pubic symphysis



Step 13

Flex the hip to 90 degrees and adjust as necessary



Hand tighten the screws by turning clockwise and tighten sagittal plane adjustment screw by turning



Step 19

Log roll patient to right side of bed

Place posterior section of brace with








Step 23

Feed the right hand strap under the patient along the bed and pull through until the brace is symmetrical at the back









clockwise



Step 17

Place anterior shell into abdominal section of the brace









Ensure posterior upright section is vertical in relation to the lumbar section of the brace



Step 22



Step 16

Place waist pads back in position

Step 6 against back section



Place anterior shell onto abdominal section and adjust height to three

distal trim to area of mid buttock

Step 15

Adjust sagittal plane screw by turning 180 degrees anti clockwise so that the anterior thoracic pads fit around the chest wall. Adjust as necessary



Step 18

Reattach abdominal section to left side of the belt



Step 21

Insert posterior upright and attach onto lumbar section of the brace Please note: shoulder straps should sit three fingers below apex of the shoulder



Step 24

Log roll patient back to supine position and check symmetry of brace



Step 25

Fold over and attach abdominal section by pulling left hand side across abdomen ensuring anterior thoracic section is in the middle and pull right side across to fasten the brace



Step 28

Pull straps out and across to achieve desired fit



Step 31

Ensure at least one finger clearance at ASIS



Step 34

Check positioning of brace with the patient on a hard backed chair with hips flexed to 90 degrees



Step 26

Flex hip to 90 degrees to ensure optimum fit



Step 29

Attach shoulder straps and tighten to fit. Please note: one finger should be able to fit under the strap to ensure optimum fit



Step 32

Place hand at rib area to ensure enough clearance for the ribs



Step 35

Once final fitting is achieved attach sternal cover to anterior upright



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Remove bobbin straps and adjust bobbin as required so that the brace comfortably tensions and sits evenly on the front panel. Please note: For guidance the VENUM logos on the bobbins should not overlap. If they do, the bobbins need to be tightened



Step 30

Log roll patient to seated with legs over side of bed, check shoulder straps and symmetry of brace from front and adjust as required



Step 33

Check height of sternal pad to ensure one finger below clavicle
